Reporting to the IRS

Over the last several months, Kiwanis Clubs may have received a notice from the IRS regarding the electronic filing of Form 990-N e-postcard. Many of our clubs have questions regarding who qualifies for this new filing requirement and when the filing is due. Below are the links to the Kiwanis website with information related to this new IRS filing requirement that clubs must follow for the 2007-08 administrative year and each year thereafter.

It should be noted that this filing of Form 990-N is new for clubs that have gross receipts \$25,000 or less and the initial filing due date is February 15, 2009.
